- Advanced Beginner Tacking independently and comfortable with sitting and rising trot, with correct diagonals, beginning canter.
- Novice Comfortable walk/trot/canter on level ground, with or without stirrups.
 Comfortable with sudden changes in speed or direction. Learning correct leads.
- Intermediate Comfortable walk/trot/canter over uneven ground, with or without stirrups. Understands correct leads. Comfortable with sudden changes in speed or direction. Ability to ride green horses with some behavior problems as well.
- Advanced Comfortable and confident in all gaits over uneven ground. Understands and can train subtleties of riding such as leg yield, side pass, changing stride lengths and canter leads. Able to handle severe behavior problems calmly. Experienced with training problem horses or starting unbroken horses independently.
